21	Agricultural Finance Authority finds that the report is deficient in showing how the project is meeting its stated goal
22	and performance standards, the grant recipient(s) shall be notified of the deficiency and shall provide a changed and
23	corrected report within 30 business days. A corrected or changed report shall be submitted to the North Carolina
24	Agricultural Finance Authority within 30 business days.
25	(e) All grant funds shall be spent within 180 days of receipt by the grant recipient. If grant funds are not spent by the
